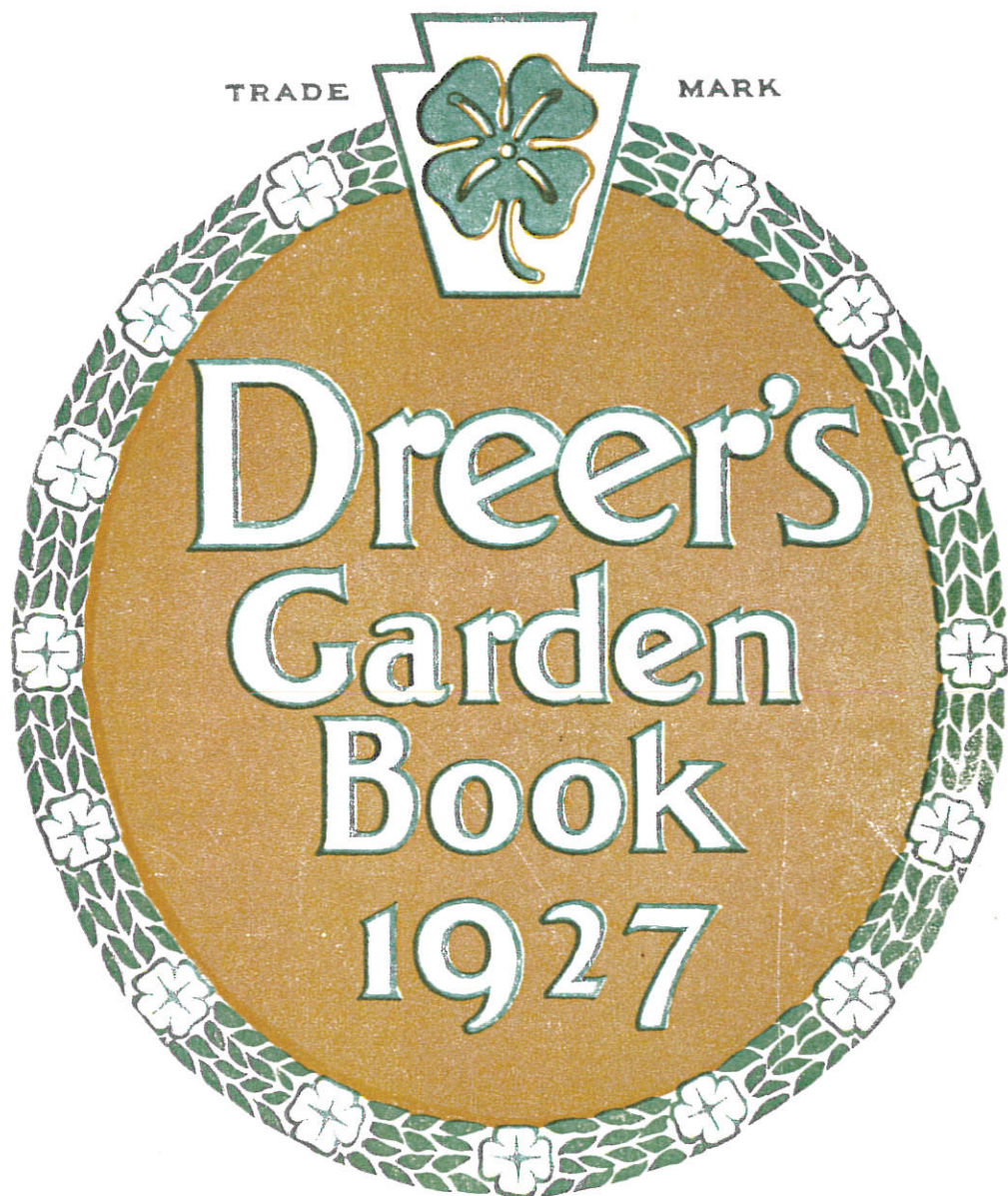
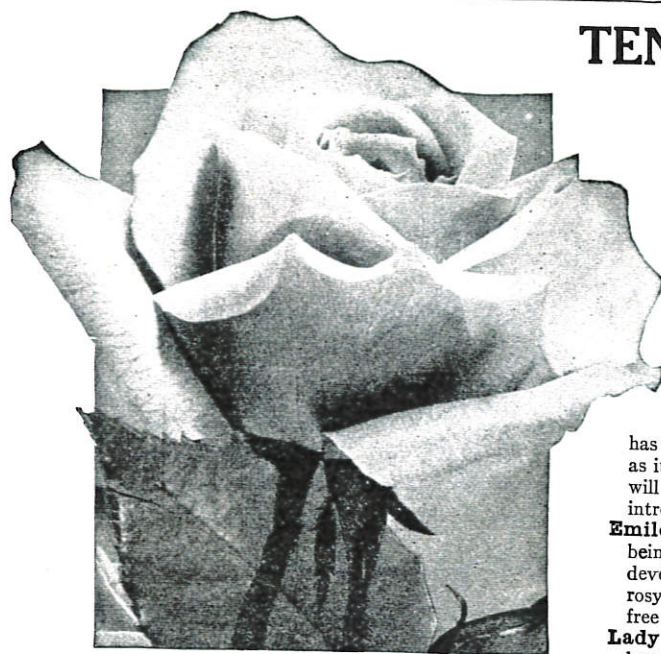

HYBRID-TEA ROSE, PINK PEARL

**Mary Pickford.** A Howard & Smith production. Named in honor of America's own favorite artist. A novel Rose of merit. In habit of growth it is strong, vigorous, not unlike Souvenir de Claudius Pernet which was one of its seed parents. Color an exquisite shade of orange-yellow stained on the reverse of the outer petals with salmon and salmon blush. The buds are of refined form, long and pointed and expand to blooms of moderate size of a deep orange yellow, shading lighter during hot dry weather. The flowers are deliciously tea scented and produced freely. \$2.00 each.

**Mrs. Erskine Pembroke Thom.** A Howard & Smith novelty. A beautiful yellow Rose which however, is entirely distinct, a clear, deep, canary-yellow without any trace of shading and which will prove a desirable addition to our list of yellow Roses. The buds are of good long shape and develop into good sized full-flowers. The plant is of strong upright, branching habit with attractive foliage and free flowering. \$2.00 each.

**Pink Pearl.** A dainty new variety from Holland which we feel convinced is destined to become a universal favorite if it had nothing to recommend it but its delicious fragrance; it is the sweetest scented Rose we know. In color it is a brilliant rich cerise pink with the base of the petals touched with luminous glowing gold that lights up the flower wonderfully particularly in the half expanded bloom. The flowers are of medium size, full double, of perfect form and produced most profusely on plants of vigorous, healthy growth. \$2.00 each.

**Mrs. Henry Bowles.** Nearly everybody has admired the old time Mme. Abel Chatenay, for a long time one of the most popular Roses but which has practically disappeared from commerce, in Mrs. Henry Bowles we have the same pleasing warm color values but in flowers of much greater size. Color a most effective deep salmon-pink and of splendid form. Vigorous growing and free flowering. \$1.50 each.

**J. Otto Thilow.** This variety of outstanding merit originated with Messrs. Verschuren & Sons and has been named in memory of our late Mr. Thilow. Color a uniform rich, glowing rose-pink. Buds long and pointed of graceful shape, as the flowers expand the petals reflex forming a full double flower of good form and large size. Plant a strong vigorous grower and very free flowering, a grand garden Rose and a splendid cut flower. \$2.50 each.

## TEN NOVELTY HYBRID-TEA ROSES

### Introductions from Various Specialists

**Bedford Crimson** (*Laxton Bros.*) This grand Rose was awarded the Clay Challenge Cup by the Royal Horticultural Society of England for the best new Rose with the best Old Rose Scent. Aside of its delightful odor it is unquestionably the most beautiful high colored Rose yet introduced, a brilliant crimson-scarlet. It is of beautiful form both in the half developed, as well as in the fully expanded bloom, being full double with an average of forty heavy substantial petals which reflex beautifully; its flowers are produced profusely on good stiff stems. It has not been as strong and vigorous a grower under our trials as it is with the originators in which, we however believe it will improve, this being frequently the case with European introductions. \$3.00 each.

**Emile Charles.** A French introduction of rich coloring, the buds being of a fiery red shaded and suffused with golden yellow, these develop to medium sized flowers of superb coral-red shading to rosy strawberry-red on the outer petals. Growth vigorous and free flowering. \$1.50 each.

**Lady Margaret Stewart.** One of Alexander Dickson & Sons latest Irish introductions which was awarded the Gold Medal of the National Rose Society of England at the 1926 Spring Show. A Rose of unique and distinct color, the flowers in the young stage are a deep sunflower yellow heavily veined and splashed with orange-scarlet with the reverse of the petals deeply suffused with carmine as the flowers develop, these colors intermingle forming a most beautiful cadmium orange effect. The bud is long and pointed, opening to a full double flower, of most pleasing decorative form of delightfully sweet scent. Growth very vigorous and upright with beautiful, glossy, deep green, serrated foliage. \$3.50 each.

**Lady Roundway.** A striking and distinct shade of rich golden-orange with deep copper-chrome suffusion. Sweetly scented, free flowering, strong, vigorous but dwarf habit. \$2.50 each.

**Lady Dixon Hartland.** Long pointed shapely buds and large flowers, deep salmon-pink at centre shading to lighter pink at the edges, very free and perpetual and sweetly scented. \$2.50 each.
