Bud long-pointed, dark orange striped coral-red; flower semi-double (12 petals), dazzling golden orange-yellow. Foliage glossy brownish red. Few thorns. Growth vigorous, bushy. Silver Gilt Medal, Nos Jungunt Rosae, The Hague, 1925; First Class Certificate, Royal Netherlands Horticultural Society, 1925.

\**Heinrich Karsch*. D. Pol. (M. Leenders & Co., 1927.) Orléans Rose X Joan. Flower medium size, semi-double, open, lasting, violet-rose, borne in clusters. Foliage sufficient, rich green. Few thorns. Growth vigorous, bushy; abundant bloomer. Hardy.

\**Hilde Apelt*. HT. (M. Leenders & Co., 1927.) Unnamed seedling X Souvenir de Claudius Pernet. Bud and flower large, double, lasting, moderately fragrant, saffron-yellow, borne singly on long stem. Foliage sufficient, medium size, rich green, disease-resistant. Average number thorns. Growth very vigorous, upright; moderate bloomer. Hardy.

\**Hugo Piller*. HT. (M. Leenders & Co., 1927.) Sport of Ophelia. Bud and flower large, double, lasting, very fragrant, flesh-white, center pale ecru, borne on medium-length stem. Foliage sufficient, medium size, light green. Few thorns. Growth vigorous, upright; moderate bloomer.

*J. Otto Thilow*. HT. (H. A. Verschuren & Sons, 1927.) Bud long-pointed, perfectly shaped; flower large, double, high-centered, reflexed petals, rich glowing rose-pink. Foliage disease-resistant. Growth very vigorous; profuse, continuous bloomer.

*Kardinal Schulte*. HT. (Leenders Bros., 1926.) (Jonkheer J. L. Mock X Radiance) X Commandeur Jules Gravereaux. Bud large, long-pointed; flower large, double, full, moderately fragrant, brilliant scarlet-red shaded glowing red, borne singly on long, strong stem. Foliage rich, glossy green, mildew-resistant. Few thorns. Growth very vigorous, upright, bushy, profuse bloomer. First Prize, Düsseldorf; Prix d'Honneur, Mainz.

*Marquise d'Andigné*. HT. (Leenders Bros., 1927.) (Lieut. Chauré X George C. Waud) X Laurent Carle. Bud large, long-pointed; flower very large, double, very full, extremely lasting, strong fragrance, velvety scarlet-crimson, resembling Laurent Carle, but deeper, borne singly on

long, strong stem. Foliage dark green, disease-resistant. Few thorns. Growth very vigorous, bushy; profuse bloomer. Second Class Certificate, Bagatelle; Gold Medal, Saverne, Prix d'Honneur, München-Gladbach.

*Mevrouw G. A. van Rossem*. HT. (G. A. van Rossem, 1926.) Souv. de Claudius Pernet X Gorgeous. Bud ovoid, opens freely in dull and moist weathers. Flower large, double, full, very fragrant, heavily flamed and shaded orange and apricot on a dark golden yellow ground, reverse of petals often dark bronze and nearly brown when first open, borne on long, strong stem. Foliage very large, dark bronzy green, leathery, disease-resistant. Average number of large red thorns. Growth vigorous, upright; abundant bloomer. Large Gold Medal and Medal of Honor, Nos Jungunt Rosae, The Hague, 1925; First Class Certificate, Royal Netherlands Horticultural Society, 1925.

*Nuntius Pacelli*. HT. (Leenders Bros., 1927.) Mrs. David McKee X British Queen. Bud ovoid; flower large, full, very fragrant, pure white, center cream, free from stain. Foliage rich green, mildew-resistant. Growth vigorous, bushy; profuse bloomer. Gold Medal, Saverne.

*Mlle. Bep van Rossem*. HT. (G. A. van Rossem, 1926.) Unnamed seedling X Souv. de Claudius Pernet. Bud long-pointed; flower medium size, very lasting, dark canary-yellow, opens gradually and grows and fills itself out of the center. Cut flowers last 5 to 7 days in water, gaining in magnificence until they drop. Foliage dark green, mildew-resistant. Very few thorns. Growth vigorous, upright; very free blooming. Hardy. Silver Medal, The Hague, 1926; Certificate of Merit, Nos Jungunt Rosae, and Royal Horticultural Society of The Netherlands, 1925.

*Salmonia*. D. Poly. (W. Cutbush & Son, 1927.) Flower salmon-pink, better color than Orange Queen, lasting. Growth vigorous. First Class Certificate, N. M. T., Amsterdam, 1926.

*Scarlet Leader*. D. Poly. (H. Wezelburg & Son, 1927.) Type, Orléans Rose. Flower large, full, double, brilliant orange-scarlet, unfading, borne in large clusters.
